


GENERAL DISCLAIMER

The appearance and overall aesthetic of typefaces and the “site” as a whole within the following wireframes *do not* represent the final look and feel the website will take on. As with most wireframes, the sole purpose of the wireframes is to represent the structure of selected information on each page. Content in these wireframes may not necessarily be up to date or accurate with the site. Regardless, the content present is used to demonstrate the nature of what (and how) it is presented. To see how elements may look aesthetically in the final site, use the provided style tiles.

All wireframes are made with three sizes/breakpoints in consideration: mobile usage, widescreen, and a more moderate sized monitor intended to represent a 4:3 ratio monitor (henceforth referred to as such.)

In circumstances where it may otherwise not be obvious, a provided pattern emphasizes whitespace that is *not* included in the final site. The grid pattern shown below is utilized in such cases.



While this document as a whole is intended to work either digitally or printed, accessing this document through digital means is recommended. The browser window representation will be touching top and left edges of the paper (and potentially the bottom edge, if the window must continue to another page.) Depending on how this document is printed, this may result in content being cut off unintentionally.

White-on-black lines represent pages intended to link to other pages or pages with subsections (see below.) White-on-black lines will form a box around the pages they intend to flow to or the subsections the page possess.

Lines started with an asterisk represent presently planned out subsections of a page that will feature headers. Regardless, subsections may be added or subtracted later as deemed fitting.

The order in which pages are laid out is not intended to have significance in page order or otherwise.
